**PS FROM BRIAN WOOD:** During the war, many British POWs were held in Changi Jail in Singapore where they were starved and mistreated by the Japanese. Because of their poor diet, some of the men suffered a very painful condition which caused the skin of their lower abdomen to peel off and fall away. When the first Red Cross parcels arrived late in the war, the British Medical Officer seized all the jars of Marmite which contained all the minerals and vitamins which would cure this condition. The men affected were told to attend at the sick bay with a spoon and were given a spoonful of Marmite and told to come tomorrow for another spoonful. Next morning, all the men turned up apart from one who arrived some minutes later, crawling on his hands and knees in great pain. The Medical Officer said, "What on earth has happened to you?" The man replied "I don't know, Sir. I was alright until I rubbed it on." Dear Jesus, please give eternal rest to all those who fought for our freedom.

### Dear Father Hayes,

I am writing to tell you how moved I was by attending Mass at St Wulfstan's today. I was visiting Fleetwood for the weekend. I regularly travel around the country in my campervan and often attend Mass in the places I am visiting. I would like to let you know that I am particularly inspired by my experience today.

I felt immediately uplifted by the interior of the building – it is light and airy and simple and spacious. I was struck by the beautiful harvest display. I was struck by the figure of Christ on the Cross above the altar – I so prefer the more modern images of Christ rising from the Cross rather than the traditional images of Christ impaled upon it. I was struck by the significant space given to the lovely quiet Lady Chapel, which I think is unusual in churches today.

Above all, I was struck by the warm feeling of human kinship and connection within the community this morning.

The lovely lady who greeted me recognised that I was not a local, and welcomed me. She was very sympathetic to the fact that I had forgotten my hearing aids, and went out of her way to talk to me in a way that I could hear.

Without my hearing aids, much of your humorous asides to the congregation was lost on me, but I could tell by the ripples of amusement that there was a warm rapport, and that warmed me, too.

I was very impressed by the young people who served at Mass – very reverential and well-rehearsed, even if the little candle-bearers were (endearingly) a bit lost on one occasion! The thurifer-bearer deserves a prize. As a longstanding altar-server from years ago, I know how important it is to master the art gracefully and fluently.

I was touched by the eucharistic minister who smiled shiningly throughout her service, as if the giving of the host were a source of personal joy for her. I received her blessing as if it meant something real to her and to me.

After Mass I approached the organist, because I thought, as I told him, that his work made a huge contribution to the ambience of the occasion. I am an occasional member of a choir at our church in Crewe, and leader of our primary school choir. Your organist and I had a good little chat about choral matters.

To summarise: in several ways, my attendance at Mass today was an unexpected uplifting experience. I go forward, returning to my life in Congleton and Crewe, enriched and encouraged. Thank you, and many thanks to your parishioners.
