POPE FRANCIS' PRAYER INTENTION FOR FEBRUARY - For parishes to be open communities:

Pope Francis releases his prayer intention for the month of February, in which he asks parishes to be generous and open communities close to all. In his prayer intention video for February, Pope Francis asks parishes to truly be communities: places of listening and welcome whose doors are always open to all, no one excluded.

In the video, which begins with an image of the outside of a beautiful but empty parish church, followed by that of the same church full of people, thus becoming even more beautiful, Pope Francis notes that every parish should put a sign on their door saying, "Free Admission".

In a press release accompanying the second prayer intention of 2023, the Pope's Worldwide Prayer network explains that with these words Pope Francis wants to remind all of us that there are no special requirements for entering, because, as he says, "parishes are not a club for the few, which give a certain kind of social belonging."

Indeed, in Pope Francis' vision, parishes are "close-knit communities, without bureaucracy, people centred— a place where the gift of the Sacraments can be found."

This idea is conveyed by the images of the video coming from parishes around the world, which show get-togethers, talks, the distribution of aid to those most in need, visits to the elderly and the sick, pageants, and internal or external events.

In his video, Pope Francis insists on this idea of parishes continuing along the path of being a centre of welcome and listening: "They have to become once again schools of service and generosity, with their doors always open to those who are excluded. And to those included. To all."

THE PANTRY: We are very pleased to announce that Mike Smith will take over a supervisor at the pantry on Monday 5th February. We are very grateful to Mike and all our other wonderful volunteers who enable us to provide food and help for people struggling to make ends meet.

BANK CHARGES: As mentioned last week, our Finance Committee has put together an up-to-date report on Bank Charges. Since these charges came into effect last April, our team has monitored them, and we are able to say what that means for us and our parish funds.

Since April 2023 the bankers started to charge us for all transactions this means that you're offering monies cost varying amounts for us to receive, depending how you make your donations. We are currently paying about £50 a month to receive donations. Standing orders cost the parish 15p each to receive, regardless of the amount donated, this is the cheapest method. We would encourage as many people as possible to donate this way.

However, four weekly donations costs 60p per month whereas a single monthly donation costs 15p per month so monthly donations are preferred. If those who already donate by weekly standing order can change to monthly, it will save us 45p per month, per person.

Donating by card costs us 16p per £10 donated.

Donating cash costs 15p per £10 to pay into the bank and if you use pre-printed envelopes, each box of envelopes costs just over £2.

Cheques are the most expensive, costing us 50p per cheque to clear plus £1.50 per month to pay our cheques into the bank. We don't get many cheques so if we only get one cheque in a month the value of that donation is reduced by £2.

Special Collections - at the moment, those using envelopes are the only individuals who regularly contribute to special collections. These will also now be available to pay by card and there will be a basket at the back of church each week when a special collection is held.

GREAT NEWS: We are delighted to share the news that we have appointed a new headteacher for our school earlier this week, who will take up the post at the beginning of the Summer term. We will be able to share her name once the parents at her school, and ours, have been informed.
