

<u>Day For Life:</u> The theme for this year's Day for Life focuses on all who are suffering or have survived domestic abuse. You can see what's involved by reading the leaflet given out with the bulletin.

Following discussion about violence in the home and domestic violence at the Synod on the Family. Pope Francis wrote, 'Unacceptable customs still need to be eliminated. I think particularly of the shameful ill-treatment to which women are sometimes subjected, domestic violence and various forms of enslavement which, rather than a show of masculine power, are craven acts of cowardice. The verbal, physical, and sexual violence that women endure in some marriages contradicts the very nature of the conjugal union.'
