The Divine Office: A parish priest is obliged to pray the Divine Office, or Liturgy of the Hours, as it's also called, for his people every day. It is the universal prayer of the Church which, because of different time-lines, is prayed every moment of the day somewhere in the world. In recent years, just as there has been an enormous take-up in Catholics reading the Bible for themselves, so many lay people now pray the Divine Office. For those who would like to give it a go, you can download the App 'Universalis' for a one-off payment of £9.99 for life. The App can be tailored to our own Diocese so that our particular feast day celebrations, for example, the Lancashire Martyrs, are included. It's the perfect way to sanctify the day.



Re-Opening of Church: A Message from the Metropolitan Archbishops of the Catholic Church in England regarding the resumption of collective worship in England:
"We ask every Catholic to think carefully about how and when they will return to Mass. Our priests may need to consider whether it is possible to celebrate additional Masses at the weekends. Given there is no Sunday obligation, we ask you to consider the possibility of attending Mass on a weekday. This will ease the pressure of numbers for Sunday celebrations and allow a gradual return to the Eucharist for more people.
Moving forward, there will still be many people who cannot attend Mass in person. We therefore ask parishes, wherever possible, to continue live-streaming Sunday Mass, both for those who remain shielding and vulnerable, and also for those unable to leave home because of advanced age or illness.
When we return to Mass there will some differences in how the celebration takes place. For the time being, there will be no congregational singing and Mass will be shorter than usual. None of this detracts from the centrality of our encounter with the Risen Christ in the Eucharist. We ask everyone to respect and follow the guidance that will be issued and the instructions in each church."

Church openings in the Deanery: Three of the churches in our Deanery have sent their opening times for visits to the Blessed Sacrament, if you're in their area:-
St Teresa's, Cleveleys Saturdays and Wednesdays 1000-1200
St John's, Poulton Saturdays and Wednesdays 1100-1300
Sacred Heart, Thornton Fridays and Sundays 1100-1200

As most people will know by now, we opened St Wulstan's for personal visits on Wednesday of last week, with the Blessed Sacrament exposed on the High Altar. Hopefully, those who have been missing the comfort of just being able to have time with Our Lord in church will take the opportunity now afforded and enjoy the peace it brings. **The church will be open five days a week for two hours. Timings are 1000-1200 Monday, Wednesday, and Friday: 1600-1800 Tuesday and Thursday.** Unfortunately, we are unable to use St Edmund's at the moment, as all the chairs are of soft fabric, and only hard surfaces are allowed.

Help to get out and about: Community Transport is a door-to-door service available to Lancashire residents who find it difficult to access public transport. Fares are payable to the driver (currently £2 each way) and can provide access to local supermarkets and other destinations. Tel: 01772 537290 for info.

Work Progresses at the Hospital: With the easing of restrictions, work has resumed on The Pantry at Fleetwood Hospital. The new facility, which will be a base for the Mustard Seed and Fleetwood Foodbank, is now due to open later in the Summer.
