<u>Update on the Moria Appeal:</u> The Ripple Charity have written to say: "A BIG thank you for all your support. Over the last few weeks, we have continued to collect and sort aid for Refugees in Moria and other areas in need of supplies, after the devastating fire. So far, we have sent 8 pallets with specific items that were donated and requested, and we have received notification that these have now arrived and are being distributed to the families in crisis. The response to this appeal has been amazing from the people on the Fylde Coast, we are so grateful for every item donated each of which has been issued out to the Refugees in one of the camps. On behalf of all those displaced people who are not able to provide for themselves or their families due to the appalling circumstances they find themselves in......THANK YOU
