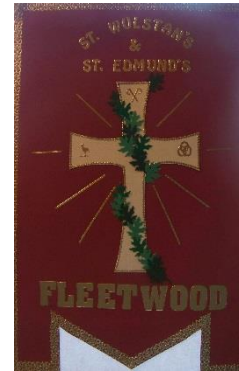

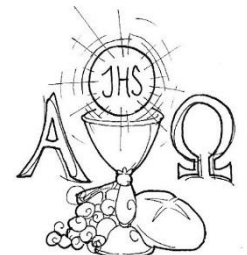

Safeguarding: Our Bishops are taking very seriously the findings of the recent National Catholic Safeguarding Project, and have asked for an audit of all Parish Volunteers throughout the country, which is essential to establish the extent of Safeguarding Awareness within the Catholic Church. The audit will be taken from a national survey, Our Parish Safeguarding Reps, Tony Conboye and Ruth Brown-Leng, have forwarded the survey to all parishioners we know of who are involved with children up to 18yrs of age or vulnerable adults. It's very simple to fill in and must be completed prior to June 25th. If you have received the survey, but are no longer a parish volunteer, please let the Parish Reps know so that Parish records can be updated.

PASTORAL MINISTRY UPDATE: It only seems like a few weeks ago that Father Alf first phoned me to ask if I would like to consider undertaking this course, and here we are a third of the way through our first year. Our last module has been a brief look at the Old Testament.

Before this course I have to say that I had tried on many occasions to read the OT, but it always left me frustrated, confused and, to be honest, it scared me as well. I could never associate what I saw as a vengeful God, who only punished people, with the caring forgiving God that I identified with, and whom I knew was always there protecting and guiding me. Even when I was at the lowest points of my life he never abandoned me and certainly never punished me. I was amazed how, over the 6 weeks we studied and discussed it within our groups, how Dorothy our lecturer helped us to see the OT in a new light, as we had all previously struggled with it.

She helped us understand that the Old Testament is written as an interpretation of the word of God and it is not literal. We saw that God was actually guiding his chosen people and giving them choices. I found myself waiting for the next week's assignments so I could look further at God's word in the Old Testament. Before this course I had acquired a Bible only a few years ago. I now own 4. As Dorothy says, you can never have enough Bibles. I love reading the same texts in each one as there are slight differences and this all adds to how the word of God is interpreted. Do I fully understand all that is written in the Old Testament? No. Will I ever? Probably not. Do I now appreciate the word of God within it? Definitely better than I did.

We are far from the end and no doubt will continue to doubt our ability to complete this course, as we strive to further develop our understanding of why God has guided us down this path of Ministry. All we ask is that you keep both Kim and I in your thoughts and Prayers as we embark on our next Module "The New Testament". God Bless you all. Catherine and Kim
