Pilgrims of Hope – Part One By Matthew Vincent

As the Diocese of Lancaster celebrates its Jubilee and Centenary year, we have been called to embrace the theme "Pilgrims of Hope." This theme has been widely shared across the diocese, particularly during the beginning of Lent, including in my own school, Cardinal Allen Catholic High School. It has encouraged me to reflect on the nature of faith—what it means to have it, to seek it, and to nurture it within ourselves and others.

It struck me recently that while faith is supposed to be an unconditional obligation, the reality is that it often isn't. I do not believe that faith in God is simply a decision we make, just as love for a friend or a romantic partner is not a decision. We cannot simply wake up one morning and command ourselves to love someone; rather, love is something that grows through experience, through time spent together, through understanding and appreciation.

Faith is much the same for me. I can and do cultivate it—by prayer, by attending Mass, by engaging with Scripture, by contemplating the beauty of creation, by striving to live according to Christ's teachings—but I cannot simply decide to have it, no matter how much I want to. I often find myself longing for the certainty of belief—that unwavering, unshakable faith that I see in others. Yet, in all honesty, my own faith fluctuates. I have many moments of certainty, of course. I think of the miracle of creation, of the existence of love, of my family, and in that, I can often feel God's presence. But I also have moments of doubt.

That struggle, I have come to realise, is not a failure. It is a journey. And it is one that many people in the Catholic Church will share. (*To be continued in the next edition...*)
