

Help with the Garden: As mentioned earlier, we are trying to create a vegetable garden at the presbytery, which, hopefully, will supply fresh food for the Food Bank eventually. One or two parishioners have helped me to dig the beds, but it's quite tough and not doing my back much good. We've four more beds to go. If anyone can spare a couple of hours next week to help turn them over, or just do a bit, it would be very gratefully appreciated. Obviously, you would have to work on your own or maintain social distancing if accompanied. Tools are provided. Let Fr Alf know if you can help. Thank you. <u>Glory Bees</u>: Our girls are out in force at the moment, and, hopefully, if the good weather persists, we may have a more successful honey crop than last year's bad summer allowed. You can help by making your garden bee-friendly eg grow lots of traditional cottage-garden flowers such as catmint, lavender, lupins, comfrey, geraniums and scabious. Grape hyacinth and lungwort are great for early spring, while asters, cosmos and helenium flower into autumn. Bees have different length tongues, so grow both deep flowers like foxgloves, and shallow ones like dyers chamomile. Don't use pesticides.
