<u>Danger to the Glory Bees:</u> You may have heard in the news that there is great danger to our honey bees from the Asian Hornet, which has been found in large numbers in France and the Channel Islands, and in isolated pockets in England, mainly in the South at the moment. The Asian Hornet is one inch long, and preys on the much smaller honey bee. It lurks under the hive and grabs the bee as it returns laden with pollen, kills it and feeds its wing muscles to its own larvae. We are asked to keep a keen eye out for it and report any sightings immediately. Maria has put a large photo of an Asian Hornet on the website to help you recognise one. You could perhaps take a photo of it to reference on your phone. If you spot one in real life, take a photo and email it to alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk, or use the Asian hornet App.

Notes from Healthier Fleetwood:

Saying it with flowers. Although this year's North West in Bloom has been cancelled, a small group of volunteers is helping to brighten up Fleetwood with floral displays. Bikes for Heroes. This project takes unwanted bicycles for refurbishment, then donates them to NHS Staff across the Fylde Coast. Fleetwood Together. A reminder that help is still needed as we continue to support the community by coordinating the distribution of food and essential items to local residents in need. We are helping around 500 households per week and donations are welcome to maintain this invaluable service.

Bishops' Statement on The Government's Covid-19 Recovery Strategy: In Dialogue with the Government, the Catholic Church has already submitted a detailed plan, in full accordance with public health guidelines, for churches to be opened for private prayer, as a first step towards their use for public worship. The Government's position (as at 28th May) is: "To establish a task force for places of worship aimed at opening churches as soon as possible, to work closely with 'stakeholders' in ensuring that premises are Covid-19 secure; and heeding the experience of other countries in which churches are already open for worship". (So, in effect, we are no further forward in knowing when we can re-open). However, in his latest Ad Clerum Bishop Paul has advised us to start stocking up on required essentials such as hand sanitisers, disinfectant, marking tape etc. Detailed instructions on opening churches will be given when the time is appropriate, ie when the guidelines have been agreed by the Government and the Bishops' Conference.
