

Danger to the Glory Bees: You may have heard in the news that there is great danger to our honey bees from the Asian Hornet, which has been found in large numbers in France and the Channel Islands, and in isolated pockets in England, mainly in the South at the moment. The Asian Hornet is one inch long, and preys on the much smaller honey bee. It lurks under the hive and grabs the bee as it returns laden with pollen, kills it and feeds its wing muscles to its own larvae. We are asked to keep a keen eye out for it and report any sightings immediately. Maria has put a large photo of an Asian Hornet on the website to help you recognise one. You could perhaps take a photo of it to reference on your phone. If you spot one in real life, take a photo and email it to alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk, or use the Asian hornet App.

Re-Opening of Church: As you will have heard, the Government is allowing religious buildings to re-open for individual private prayer from this Monday 15th June, which is fabulous news for all who have missed being able to spend time with Jesus, really and truly present, in the Blessed Sacrament. However, there are quite a few regulations governing how we are to implement a safe return, and we are still awaiting instructions from the Diocese. One thing we do know is that there will have to be two stewards on duty to wipe down benches etc after each visit, so could we please have some volunteers. There will be training for stewards. We will use the big church rather than the Lady Chapel, because there's more space for people to spread out and for families, from the same household, to come to pray together as a group. We're planning to open for two hours a day but at different times to make it easier for people with different schedules to visit. As soon as we have more details of what we have to do, we will let you know. If you can take a turn at stewarding, please let Fr Alf or Maria D know as soon as possible. Thank you.
