

<u>Re-Opening of Church:</u> As most people will know by now, we opened St Wulstan's for personal visits on Wednesday of this week, with the Blessed Sacrament exposed on the High Altar. Hopefully, those who have been missing the comfort of just being able to have time with Our Lord in church will take the opportunity now afforded and enjoy the peace it brings. **The church will be open five days a week for two hours**. **Timings are 1000-1200 Monday**, **Wednesday**, **and Friday: 1600-1800 Tuesday and Thursday**. Unfortunately, we are unable to use St Edmund's at the moment, as all the chairs are of soft fabric, and only hard surfaces are allowed.

With this easing down, we need to start thinking ahead to when we're allowed to celebrate public Masses again. I suspect social distancing rules will stay in force for quite some time, so we will need to keep the 2 metre layout we have in situation now, which provides space for 28 individuals (or more if in family groups). If the rule changes to 1 metre we could accommodate about 50 people for Mass. So, how do we cater for our usual much larger Mass numbers?

My initial thoughts are: To carry on broadcasting Sunday Mass on the website, because everyone with internet access can be part of it. But to give everybody chance to attend Mass in person, at least once a week, I would celebrate Mass every weekday at 12noon, with an evening Mass on Thursday to allow for the workers. Obviously, because of restricted numbers, it would be very helpful to know which Mass you would prefer and be likely to attend. It may also be possible, weather permitting, to celebrate an outdoor Mass in the school grounds, which would allow for a bigger congregation. At Holy Communion, the chalice will not be used and the sacred host will be received in the hand. I would wear a face mask and sanitise my hands beforehand.

These are just a few ideas I have, and would welcome helpful suggestions. No doubt there will be more instructions from the Diocese when we get the go-ahead.

The Divine Office: A parish priest is obliged to pray the Divine Office, or Liturgy of the Hours, as it's also called, for his people every day. It is the universal prayer of the Church which, because of different time-lines, is prayed every moment of the day somewhere in the world. In recent years, just as there has been an enormous take-up in Catholics reading the Bible for themselves, so many lay people now pray the Divine Office. For those who would like to give it a go, you can download the App 'Universalis' for a one-off payment of £9.99 for life. The App can be tailored to our own Diocese so that our particular feast day celebrations, for example, the Lancashire Martyrs, are included. It's the perfect way to sanctify the day.

Thank You: Hardly a day goes by where I don't arrive back at the presbytery to find either donations of food or money, often given anonymously, for the Food bank. It is greatly appreciated, so thank you. You will be pleased to hear, I'm sure, that we were also successful with our bid to the Albert Gubay Foundation for a donation of £20,000 which will help to keep us going for the next few weeks.
