<u>A gentle reminder:</u> Please do not attend Mass if you have any of the following symptoms: a fever; a new persistent cough; shortness of breath; a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell. If you do experience any of these symptoms, you should self-isolate for 10 days as per new government guidance, and call 119 for a swab test.

<u>Special Collections</u>: The Holy See and Bishops' Conference have requested that the special collections that were not taken during the pandemic should be rescheduled for the autumn. Parishioners who have already put the relevant special collection envelopes in are not asked to give a second time. The Bishop will circulate a list of dates for our diocese, when these become available, and has asked that at this time, we should not forget to support, for example, the Apostleship of the Sea, which is helping seafarers stranded on ships.


We believe that it is you who guides the course of human history and that your love can change our destiny for the better, whatever our human condition may be.

<u>World Creation Day:</u> Pope Francis has established 1 September as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, encouraging the Catholic community around the world to pray for our common home. The day is inspired by his encyclical "Laudato Si", which calls on "every person living on this planet" to care for our shared Earth, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for its protection." This Day of Prayer begins the Season of Creation, observed by Christians around the world, which runs until 4 October, the feast of St Francis of Assisi, dedicated to prayer for the protection of creation and the promotion of sustainable lifestyles.

The key messages from Pope Francis include the following:

• We are called to protect creation-and we are missing the mark. "Something good in the eyes of God has become something exploitable in human hands."

• The Season of Creation is a "time to re-acquaint ourselves with praying immersed in nature, where our gratitude to the creator God arises spontaneously."

• The Season of Creation is a time to grow in sustainability. "This is the time to reflect on our lifestyles... Let's change and adopt simpler and more respectful lifestyles!"

• The Season of Creation is a time to urge governments to enact better climate policies. "This is the time to take prophetic actions" and governments have the task of "demonstrating political will, to drastically hasten their measures to reach net-zero greenhouse gas emissions as soon as possible . . . in line with the Paris Agreement goals."

**The Last Rites:** I have noticed in recent years, that many Catholics in our parish have died without receiving the last sacraments. In days gone by, the first person a Catholic family called when someone was dying, or seriously ill, was the priest. Nowadays, often the first time I know someone has died is when the funeral director rings to book a funeral. This could be because the family of the deceased does not practice, or is maybe unaware of the power of these sacraments which include absolution, anointing and, if the dying person is able, receiving Holy Communion - ("viaticum" or food for the final journey). Receiving these sacraments when preparing to meet Our Lord face to face, brings tremendous consolation to people of faith, and often a wonderful peace of mind. It's a tradition we should make our children aware of for when the time comes.

#### REPEAT NOTICES

<u>Sunday Mass</u>: We are once again celebrating Mass in St Wulstan's on Sundays at 1000. Mass will continue to be televised at the same time for those unable to, or not yet ready to, return to a publicly celebrated Mass. We are acutely aware that the Covid crisis is not yet over, and is unlikely to be, until a vaccine is found. For that reason we have taken a very cautionary and gradual approach to getting back to 'Normal' by distributing Mass times throughout the week, allowing more people to come than could have been fitted in on a Sunday. Hopefully, until things do return to normal, some people will still attend Mass on their chosen weekday, in order to share the opportunities available for Mass.

### A few reminders about attending Mass to ensure the safety of all present:

- \* Face masks must be worn in church and social distancing (1m) should be observed at all times.
- If you wish to light a candle please do so before Mass so that, at the end of Mass, everyone can leave in an orderly manner without causing congestion.
- Please wait until you are away from the church building to stop for a chat.
- Please follow the directions from the stewards who are there to help you will be invited to receive communion one person from each side of church alternately, and invited to leave church in an ordered way to ensure everyone's safety.
- Please try not to touch church benches or other surfaces unnecessarily.
- Church is open half an hour before the start of each Mass, please do not come earlier as there must be two stewards present whenever church is open for Mass. (Bishops' directive)
