

NEW NOTICES

Local Appeal for Refugee Camp on Lesbos, Greece: You may have seen last week the heartbreaking images of the asylum-seekers and migrants who lost their homes and all their possessions in the fire at Moria Camp. People are, of course, donating money to help, but essential supplies and basic items such as personal hygiene products, toiletries, nappies, new underwear, new socks, warm clothing and suitable footwear, blankets and sleeping bags are desperately needed too. The Ripple Effect Charity, based in Lancaster, is collecting such items to support the families in Moria. If you can, please help by donating some of the above. They can be brought to all Masses from Sunday 20th September until Sunday 27th September and left at the back of church, from where they will be collected and taken to Lancaster, for onward shipment to Greece on 3rd/4th October. As you can see the need is quite immediate, and we only have a week to collect. You can also drop items off at the presbytery. Thank you. If you have any queries, please phone Patricia on: 874480.

<u>Corona Virus Latest:</u> The 'Rule of Six' which came into effect last Monday, does not affect Sunday Mass and other acts of public worship in churches and chapels which, like us, are Covidsecure. Regular church services are regarded on the same level as workplaces because we have Covid-secure practices, so Mass with a congregation is allowed to go ahead but face coverings must be worn.

The rules for Funerals, Baptisms and Weddings are different because these are seen by the Government as social gatherings, which could lead to unhealthy gatherings without physical distancing. That's why the Government rule continues to be a maximum of 30 people. Receptions after weddings with up to 30 are permitted. Funeral teas and post-baptism parties with more than six people present would appear not to be permitted after 14th September.

<u>Volunteers:</u> As you know, we at Fleetwood Together have been taking out crates of food to those in need throughout the Pandemic. Numbers are now falling as people return to work, and previously shielded people are able to get out to do their shopping. One consequence is that many of our volunteers have also returned to work, which has left us short of helpers for the various tasks necessary to make the scheme work like clockwork. At the end of September most of the work will transfer to 'The Pantry' in the old hospital, for which we have many volunteers, but in the meantime if you can help at St Edmund's in any capacity, it would be greatly appreciated. We could also do with more drivers. In particular, as I take a day off on a Monday, could anyone join Steve Doherty in the minibus on Mondays from 1000-1230?
