

The new NHS COVID-19 app: available to download for free in England and Wales from 24 September, is the fastest way to see if you're at risk from coronavirus. The faster you know, the quicker you can alert and protect your loved ones and community. When someone enters a venue and scans an official NHS QR code poster, the venue information will be logged on their phone. They may then receive alerts and notifications if Coronavirus is detected at a venue they have visited and local public health teams think it is necessary. For more details, see www.covid19.nhs.uk

Local Appeal for Refugee Camp on Lesbos, Greece: You may have seen last week the heart-breaking images of the asylum-seekers and migrants who lost their homes and all their possessions in the fire at Moria Camp. People are, of course, donating money to help, but essential supplies and basic items such as personal hygiene products, toiletries, nappies, new underwear, new socks, warm clothing and suitable footwear, blankets and sleeping bags are desperately needed too.
