<u>Votive Candles</u>: Just a reminder that votive candles should be lit *before* Mass. The reason behind this Covid rule is to avoid people congregating near the exit through the Lady Chapel when Mass is over.

<u>Other Covid Reminders</u>: Please do not attend Mass if you have any of the following symptoms: a fever; a new persistent cough; shortness of breath; a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell. If you do experience any of these symptoms, you should self-isolate for 10 days as per government guidance, and call 119 for a swab test. As we are now in Tier 3 restrictions, please remember "hands, face, space" when you come to church, especially social distancing outside church.

<u>Try Praying - "Use it then Lose it":</u> In these times of transition and tension people are increasingly open to prayer and to good news. But they need someone to invite them. *"How can people have faith in the Lord and ask them to save them, if they have never heard about him? And how can they hear, unless someone tells them?" (Romans 10:14 CEV).* The concept of "Trypraying" is to encourage churches to give their parishioners a free booklet to use for themselves for a week, then to look for a God-given moment or opportunity to lose it, by passing it on to somebody who might not use prayer in their life...simple but effective eh? Imagine some of your friends, neighbours and colleagues taking the next step into their journey with God because you have made them aware of trypraying. We already have 50 copies to give away to you.
