Many people have asked what sort of things to buy or offer. At the moment, we are short of gifts for some age groups, eg teen boys or girls, adult men, and older men 65+. 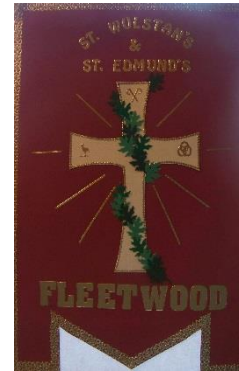
