<u>Ash(less?) Wednesday:</u> The great season of Lent begins this Wednesday with Mass at 1200 noon. Normally, at this Mass, we would each receive ashes on our foreheads as a visible sign of recognising our mortality, and of our intention to do some form of penance. Under current Coronavirus restrictions, we are not allowed impose the ashes, but sprinkling ashes is apparently acceptable, so we'll see what you think on the day! Ash Wednesday, like Good Friday, is a day of fasting and abstinence for all Catholics in good health, aged between 16 and 65. For those still thinking what to do for Lent, maybe a daily prayer, or praying the rosary each day, for an end to the coronavirus pandemic, for those still suffering from it, and for those doing their best to combat it, might be an idea.
