Sister Anne's main concern is to find accommodation for them, and she wonders whether any parishioners would like to offer, somebody who would appreciate the company of young people after the loneliness of lockdown or the children moving out? Holy Week: As mentioned last week, we will, thank God, be able to celebrate Holy week in church this year. However, due to Covid there have to be certain restrictions which are as follows: *Palm Sunday* - palms will be blessed at the beginning of Mass as usual but will be distributed by the stewards as you leave at the end of Mass. *Maundy Thursday* - there will be no washing of the feet, procession to, or watching at, the altar of repose, and no Compline / Night Prayer. *Good Friday* - Stations of the Cross will be as usual with people remaining in the benches as the priest moves round.
