

**Pro Life:** A note from 'Right to Life': Carla Lockhart MP has launched a parliamentary motion calling on the Government to end 'DIY' home abortion. If 'DIY' home abortions become permanent, this will be a very big change to abortion provision that will likely lead to the loss of many more lives - and it is likely that this will have a strong negative impact on the physical and emotional health of women. It is therefore vital that as many MPs as possible sign Carla Lockhart's motion to send a clear message to the Government that they must end dangerous 'DIY' home abortion services as soon as possible. 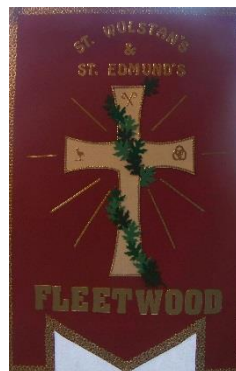

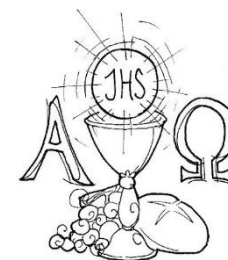

**Saving our Common Home:** The letter for Pentecost from the Bishops of England and Wales spoke of two important meeting this year that *will gather together men and women who have the power to make defining choices and policies which will help us build back better, provide for our brothers and sisters, and take care of our common home*, - G7 in June and COP26 in November.

**What is CAFOD calling for from the G7 Summit?** G7 countries must lead the way in tackling the immediate global health crisis, the economic consequences of the pandemic and the ongoing climate crisis. CAFOD is urging G7 leaders to support the poorest nations by cancelling all debt payments owed by low-income countries so that those countries have the money they need to recover and rebuild from the pandemic. Many of the world's poorest countries are currently having to choose between paying those debts and helping their communities recover from the coronavirus. The G7 must also provide support to poorer countries to tackle the immediate health crisis and poverty caused by the pandemic. Also, the nations at the summit must set out urgent cuts in greenhouse gas emissions given that the countries in the G7 are amongst those with the greatest historic responsibility for the climate crisis. This includes ending all support for fossil fuels and adequate financial support for the hardest hit nations.

**Kick Start:** You will all have heard of the Government's programme to help young people enter the jobs market. Steve Newsham from the Regenda Group is our local co-ordinator and has forwarded some Good News: "We have now forwarded our first group of Kickstart vacancies to the DWP portal.

These are as follows:

Fleetwood Regenda Homes - 2 roles - Assistant Environmental Warden and Community Responder (for Healthier Fleetwood).

FCMS/PDS - 3 roles - Admin, Health Care Assistant and Corporate Wellbeing Admin.

Fleetwood High School - 6 Roles.

O'Briens Pharmacy - 6 roles.

These roles will be for 25 hours each week on national minimum wage. DWP will forward interested applicants to us but if you know any youngsters (18-25yrs) on Universal Credit who may be interested, guide them to their local Job Coach at the Job Centre.
