

STOP THE 14 DAY LIMIT: You may be aware that there are plans by the Human Fertilisation and Embryology Authority (HFEA) to remove the 14-day limit for experimenting on embryos. Despite <u>97% of submissions</u> from the general public to the HFEA's own consultation objecting to this proposal, the HFEA is lobbying the Government to proceed with a change in this legislation that would pave the way for the removal of the 14-day limit.
