PS FROM BRIAN WOOD: At our former Parish in Eccles, Father Michael encouraged a young boy who suffered from cerebral palsy to become an altar server. He learned well and became a regular part of the team. On one occasion, Judith and I arrived for Mass and saw the boy sitting on the Sanctuary, with the big Lectionary on his knee, reading intensely. After a while he had obviously finished what he was reading but instead of closing the Lectionary quietly, he slammed it shut with his whole strength. It sounded like a bomb had gone off and the noise reverberated around the high ceiling for several seconds. In front of me was an old lady deep in prayer and she jumped at least a foot in the air and everyone else was clearly very shaken. Many prayers were disturbed that night, and no one dozed off. Dear Jesus, please give Father Michael eternal rest and let him rest in peace. Amen.
