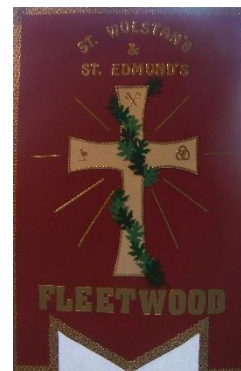
PS FROM BRIAN WOOD:

SPIRITUALITY: Now that life is back to normal after Christmas, some of our prayer groups are up and running again. Bibel Share is back once a fortnight on Thursdays after Mass, as is the Saturday morning shared prayer group after Mass. Everyone is welcome to come along.

EXPOSITION AND BENEDICTION: As you know, we have a weekly Holy Half Hour every Wednesday after Mass at which we always pray for an increase in vocations to the Priesthood. People who work can't make those times and recently I've had a request for another time for silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. So, I propose to restore the Saturday morning time we used to have before Covid. So, from Saturday 20th January, we will have exposition after Mass till 10.20 during which I will be available for confession as in the past.
