I didn't want to keep him from what he was doing but it was he who prolonged the conversation at every turn, with enthusiasm. It was a sheer delight to spend time with this gracious gentleman and experience his enthusiasm for his sport. Some years later, when Eddie died, I wrote to his son and described my meeting with his father. I received a very kind and gracious reply. Like father, like son, Dear Jesus, please give eternal rest to Eddie and let perpetual light shine upon him. Amen,

SYNODALITY: Over the last year we have not heard much about the buildup to the Synod & Synodality, which takes place towards the end of the year. This is going to be so important for the future of the Church, and indeed the world, so the more we know about it, the better. Luckily, we have on of our own, who was present at the Synodal meetings in Rome, to bring us up to date. She is Professor Anna Rowlands from Poulton.

On Thursday, May 30th at 7pm in English Martyrs Church Hall, Highcross Road POULTON FY6 8DA, Professor Anna Rowlands will be speaking to us about the SYNOD and answering our questions on Zoom. Professor Rowlands has been a theological advisor to the SYNOD ON SYNODALITY from 2021 when Pope Francis called the whole Church to engage in this. So, she has rich experience to share with us to help us as we prepare for the second SYNODAL ASSEMBLY in October. Everyone is most welcome!

THE NEW DEBT CRISIS - MESSAGE FROM CAFOD: Just last week, week, Pope Francis called for action to address the new debt crisis that's crippling lower income countries. Over three billion people are living in countries where governments are spending more money on debts than on health or education. As record sums of money flow from the poorest nations to line the pockets of the world's biggest banks, we need to take a stand. We're calling on political parties to address this by passing a 'Debt Justice Law' if they form the next government. Will you join us by adding your name to our petition?

The UK has the power to tackle this. Because the majority of loans granted by big banks are governed by English law, the government could legislate to force lenders to stop demanding payments from countries facing a debt crisis.

Pope Francis has declared next year a 'Jubilee year', which in the Church is historically a time for cancelling debt and restoring equality. Just last week the Pope said, "I ask that [affluent nations] acknowledge the gravity of so many of their past decisions and determine to forgive the debts of countries that will never be able to repay them. More than a question of generosity, this is a matter of justice." As we prepare for the next Jubilee year, and approach a general election, will you take action now by writing to the UK's political leaders calling for a new Debt Justice Law?
