
### END OF LIFE PATHWAY - COURSE OFFERED BY FLEETWOOD CHURCHES TOGETHER:

A number of other venues also hold coffee mornings and friendship groups, and welcome new members to attend although there may be a fee or donation towards the costs.

<u>PS FROM BRIAN WOOD</u>: During the later part of the war, before D-Day, General Dwight Eisenhower travelled throughout the UK speaking to the American troops. There was to be no food wasted. On one occasion, he was visiting an airfield and had just eaten a large meal before he arrived there. He entered the mess hall and sat talking to the airmen. Whilst he was talking, one of the cooks came out of the kitchen and placed a plateful of food on the table in front of him. He was busy talking and did not notice. Suddenly, he saw the food and said, "It's the same rule for everyone." and immediately ate every scrap of food on the plate! Dear Jesus, please help us to give thanks for the food we have when so many in the world are going hungry.
