Let us begin our period of preparation now. For reflection, let us consider how we will prepare for His Nativity. What extra time may we spend in prayer and contemplation? How soon can we obtain the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Let us begin preparation for the coming of Our Lord!

At that point, they received a signal from the Admiral who had been watching from his balcony high up the hillside. The signal said simply " Too sloppy.....cast off.....do it again." They had to go through the whole rigmarole again. How pleased they all were! Dear Jesus, we thank you for all those who spend their lives keeping us safe. Please keep them safe too.
